South Penn Railroad Historian to Address Historical Society

The Fulton County Historical Society's Summer Membership Meeting will be held on Saturday, June 30, 2018, at 7 p.m. at the FCHS Museum Annex Banquet Room.

The Banquet room is located at the rear of the building, with parking available at the McConnellsburg Firehall parking lot.

The speaker will be Russell Love, who has been researching the South Pennsylvania Railroad for the last 15 years. A grandly planned railroad from the late 1880s through 1900, the South Pennsylvania Railroad was to cross over and tunnel through multiple mountains and traverse over rivers, and would include Fulton County. Despite much work done to create the beds to lay the rail ties, the line was never completed. Love became aware of the railroad while traveling on the Pennsylvania Turnpike and, after learning of its history, was hooked on tracing the proposed route that was later to be abandoned.

Love will present his years of research on what is called The Railroad That Never Was. He will use maps and illustrations to show where the route was started and work was completed. This meeting is open to the public. If you are interested in the history of railroads in Southern PA and Fulton County, you don't want to miss this presentation.

Summer Exhibit on Display at Fulton House

"An Overly-Raker Retrospective" is the title of the Fulton County Historical Society's summer display at the Fulton House.

The exhibit depicts the creative business journey of Helen Overly and Freda Raker from a small in-house gift shop to a multimillion-dollar soft sculpture industry known throughout the nation and beyond.

Countless examples of Overly-Raker products will be on display including soft sculpture, dolls, 'sculpy' creations, watercolors, prints, cards and jewelry, including an example of the soft sculpture that was used to decorate the White House for Christmas in 1986.

Also, there will be magazines, scrapbooks and catalogs of O-R products available to browse through, covering the early 1970s through the 90s.

Annual Book in Preparation

John Nelson and Ken Keebaugh have done extensive research on the African-American community in Fulton County. Members whose dues are paid for 2018 will receive a copy of this Volume 39 for the current year. This comprehensive history will be titled *Poetry Not Yet Written* based on a phrase from the movie "Glory". Chapters will include a few known slaveholders, the Heritage Heights community, the Hunter Road community, the Underground Railroad, Civil War incidents, and family names from the U.S. Census for Fulton County. Also included will be names of veterans, including a family who sent four sons to fight in World War II, one of whom gave his life for our country.

Museum Annex Business Exhibits

With 50% matching funds from the Lincoln Highway Heritage Corridor, we started constructing replicas of three local shops from the late 1800s in our new Museum Annex.

The three buildings were located along the Lincoln Highway and were selected based on a large quantity of donated items, which will fill a newspaper print shop, a woodworking shop, and a tinsmith shop. Brian Tucker prepared scale drawings from original



photographs, and Mark Sheffield with other volunteers started constructing facades this spring. We'd like the shops to be a "step back in time" but also offer possibilities for interactive teaching projects.

Minutes for FCHS Spring Membership Meeting and Banquet held on March 31, 2018

The Fulton County Historical Society held its Annual Spring Membership Banquet Meeting at the Hustontown Fire Hall on March 31, 2018. President Dick Miller called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: of the Winter Membership Meeting as printed in the Spring Newsletter were approved on a motion by Mike Crampton, seconded by Mark Sheffield.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Gene Leese reported the society raised approximately \$80,000 for the G.C. Murphy project since it began in December 2016; has spent approximately \$63,000 remodeling the Murphy Building; leaving the FCHS with a balance of about \$17,000 in funds dedicated to the project. The appeal for donations has brought in \$5,101 in 2018, and a refund of \$1,600 came from the electrical provider for upgrades.

Dick Miller announced this was his last year as president. He introduced board members and officers Mike Crampton, Monica Seville, Linda Mellon, Linda Garber, Mark Sheffield, Ken Keebaugh, Doug Brown, Gene Leese and Debbie Reed.

Volunteers who helped in the Library, Fulton House and Murphy Building Museum Annex were Glenn Cordell, Tom Duffey, Edie Coleman, Naomi Waite, Bonnie Keefer, Brian Tucker, Wayne MacDonald, John B. Nelson, Chris Sheffield and Debbie Reed.

Miller introduced distinguished guests Pennsylvania Senator John Eichelberger and former Fulton County Commissioner Dan Swain.

Miller expressed appreciation for the recent donation by Harold Comerer of a delivery wagon used in the Comerer hardware business circa 1910. It was too big to accept until the society acquired the Murphy Building. Earl Sipes of Harrisonville donated a hand carved J. Cook gun probably manufactured at Harrisonville. The Fred Wible estate donated a Stunkard gun made in New Grenada. John Gracey had donated a Stunkard gun acquired in Iowa and refurbished at Williamsburg, along with photos of family veterans.

Verda Culler Schue Hockensmith of Southern Fulton donated 1) a one horse sleigh circa 1910 including its original shipping crate. Wayne MacDonald worked on restoring the sleigh. 2) a water jug from Center one room school, 3) a wooden washing machine, 4) two ladder

back chairs and a rocking chair made by Jonas Mellott, and 5) a 1947 Green Hill High School yearbook.

Miller announced the society has for sale full collections of McConnellsburg and Hustontown - Forbes Road High School yearbooks on CD.

Ken Keebaugh displayed a map of Wells, Taylor and Dublin Townships, tracing the routes of Burd's Road of 1755, Forbes Road of 1758, the South Penn Railroad of 1884, and the Chambersburg-Bedford Turnpike of 1815-1913.

Linda Mellon presented a plaque to outgoing president Dick Miller as an

FRONTIER BARN QUILT TRAIL: Mike Crampton reported Fulton County now has 195 barn quilts, making us the largest in the state of Pennsylvania. A brochure and book picturing the quilts is planned. The Murphy Building Museum Annex facade will have a refurbished sign including a barn quilt.

AUCTION REPORT: This Fall's auction will be held at the Needmore Bible Church on November 10, 2018. All proceeds will go towards the Murphy Building roof project, estimated to cost about \$100,000. Twenty-five percent of the Marshall and Leona Reeder Estate, or \$106,000, was donated to pay for the Murphy Building. A plaque acknowledging their generosity will be placed in the Murphy Museum Annex.

HISTORIAN OF THE YEAR: Glenn

Cordell introduced Mark Sheffield, who has worked untold hours restoring the Murphy Building, including the front showcase windows, installing over 5,000 feet of oak flooring, and running off yearbook CDs at his home, bringing the cost of each yearbook down to \$0.30 per year on disc. Sheffield thanked his family for their support.
