Annual Dinner Meeting at Warfordsburg

Women of the Warfordsburg Presbyterian Church will serve a full-course meal to members of the Fulton County Historical Society on Saturday evening, April 20, at 6:30 p.m. in the church Fellowship Hall. Reservations are needed by Monday, April 15, with a check of \$11 per person given to treasurer Jane MacDonald or mailed to the Society at Box 115, McConnellsburg, PA 17233. (Directions below.)

President Clem Malot will hold a brief business session following the dinner, including the election of new Society officers for 2002-03.

Commonwealth speaker Linda Ries of the Pennsylvania State Archives, Harrisburg, will present a slide program on "Preserving Your Visual Heritage: Photography and Family History." She will provide tips on dating photos by clothing styles, identify types of photographs, and show how family photos give clues to the "soul" of an ancestor. Invite friends. The meeting is free and open to the public as a program of the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, supported in part by a grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Tonoloway Meeting House to be Opened

Enclosed with your newsletter is this year's annual publication on the History of Tonoloway Baptist Church, written by Harry S. Holman in 1980 and reprinted now for the first time. The historic Tonoloway meeting house is seldom open, but Historical Society members will have an opportunity to visit prior to the dinner meeting and see the interior. Friends of Tonoloway will open the church doors from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 20. Stop by, view the original seating, and notice the extensive preservation work done by Dan Winter and others from the Friends organization. Directions to Meeting House and Dinner

Tonoloway Church is within sight of the PA/MD line. From Hancock, take Pennsylvania Ave. north and Tonoloway Church will appear on the left soon after crossing into PA. Traveling from McConnellsburg, go south on Route 522 to Needmore, turn left on Route 655 and the church will be on your right just before crossing into MD.

The Warfordsburg Presbyterian Church is on the main street of Warfordsburg, or old Route 522, a short distance north of the High School. To reach Warfordsburg from Tonoloway Church, you might drive north on Route 655 to the first road on the left, Stillwell Road, then left on Pigeon Cove Road, cross over I-70 into Warfordsburg. From Hancock, I-70 and Route 522 North are together until the Warfordsburg exit. Turn left onto I-70 overpass, then left at intersection.
